F1 - SUID/AHT

KCF VII.B: Ensuring Safety, Trainer: Jamie Sloth

This class meets DHS Licensing training requirements for both Sudden Unexpected Infant Death (SUID) and Abusive Head Trauma (AHT). Content includes recommendations to reduce Sudden, Unexpected Infant Deaths (SUID) including SIDS, suffocation, and other sleep related infant deaths; safe sleep environments; MN Child Care regulations related to safe sleep; as well as symptoms and consequences of abusive head trauma, risk factors for abusive head trauma; strategies to use when stressed, angry or frustrated.

F2 - LACING, TRACING, AND ERASING: FINE MOTOR SKILL DEVELOPMENT IN EARLY CHILDHOOD

KCF IID: Promoting Physical Development, Trainer: Laura Lamb

Support children's fine motor skill development by applying current best practices and research-based practices. Explore how to select materials in nature and more that support the development of eye-hand coordination, hand strength, and dexterity across children from birth to preschool age. Identify signs of readiness to engage in self-help skills in collaboration with staff and families along with how to discuss developmental alerts. Identify and practice how to best interact with, create environments for, and individualize supports to maximize children's fine motor skill development in your program.
