The Early Childhood Development programs, including the certificate, diploma, and AAS degree, is designed to prepare students as child development professionals for a variety of settings.

The courses are designed for the student who plans to enter the job force immediately. The program focuses on developing an understanding of young children and their needs, and provides students with practical knowledge about the physical, social, emotional, cognitive, and creative principles that are critical in working with young children. Coursework covers child development, family dynamics, teaching strategies, and dealing with children with special needs. Courses meet the standards required by the Minnesota Department of Human Services for childcare workers.
