All current and prospective PTCC AECD/ECD students may be eligible for financial aid and grants to fund their educational program. Most funding sources require the completion of the Federal Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or must meet certain eligibility requirements to qualify. Current and prospective students are strongly encouraged to complete the FAFSA, any applicable scholarships, and grant applications early to ensure funding availability, before the start of the course.
