The Nursing Mobility program expands upon the foundational knowledge and skills of Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) who want to pursue an Associate of Science (A.S.) Degree in Nursing. The curriculum prepares nurses to practice professionalism, leadership, clinical reasoning, and adherence to the Nursing Code of Ethics. With an A.S. in Nursing, students are eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensure Exam for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). This program provides a pathway for students who wish to pursue academic advancement or seek employment in a wide variety of healthcare settings.

Application to begin AD core coursework

Students must apply to become eligible to take AD core coursework at pine.edu/nursing-mobility-as by the deadline indicated on the PTCC website.

At the time of application students must:

- Have general education coursework completed with a grade of "C" or better, and a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Be currently licensed as a Practical Nurse (LPN)
- Have taken the ATI TEAS exam within the last 2 years with an overall composite score of 68 or higher (PTCC only accepts TEAS scores from in-person proctored exams - no virtual/online testing scores are accepted)

Get the Credit You Deserve!

What is Credit for Prior Learning (CPL)?

Pine Technical & Community College (PTCC) values learning that happens outside of the classroom. Many students enrolling at PTCC bring with them a wealth of knowledge and real-world experiences that can be turned into college credit.

Ways students can gain Credit for Prior Learning:

Job skills and work experience, employer training programs, volunteer or community services, self-study, military education and occupations, industry certifications, high school articulate college credit, standardized exams.

Earning Credit for Prior Learning is Easy

- 1. Visit the CPL website at mycpl.minnstate.edu to see a full list of eligible courses, requirements, and assessment methods to determine if CPL is right for you.
- 2. Reach out to records@pine.edu to discuss CPL opportunities, payment (if required), and assessment information.



Upon Acceptance to Core Coursework

Additional Requirements Upon Acceptance into the Associate Degree Nursing Core Coursework

All requirements listed below are due 2-3 weeks prior to the start of the semester in which you have been accepted to begin core coursework. See the application timeline for details.

- Be currently licensed as a Practical Nurse (LPN)
- **Immunizations** (before submitting documents, review them to ensure all required information is included.
 - Measles/Mumps/Rubella
 - Tetanus
 - Diphtheria
 - Pertussis
 - Varicella (Chicken Pox)
 - Influenza
 - Hepatitis B
 - Tuberculosis screening

Background Study

All students must have a cleared Minnesota background study. A cleared Wisconsin background study may be required.

Current Healthcare Professional CPR

American Heart Association CPR for Healthcare Provider (BLS provider) is the only accepted CPR. Must have hands-on skills test-out.

Note: COVID vaccinations are no longer required for entrance into the PN Program at PTCC. However, clinical sites may alter their clinical requirements at any time, and PTCC students would be required to comply at that time.
